What is Adult Basic Education (ABE)?

Adult Basic Education includes GED programs, Basic Literacy, Family Literacy, Workplace Education, Corrections-based Education, Transitions to Higher Education, and English for Speakers of Other Languages.

Who Attends ABE?

4,000* residents of Cities and Towns in your district attend Massachusetts ABE Programs.

4,869 residents of Cities and Towns in your district are on ABE Program Waiting Lists.
